


FEBRUARY NEWSLETTER

The Catholic Church has a natural rhythm of quiet time and celebration, seasons of awaiting and seasons of rejoicing. "It should be our noble right and duty to bring up our children in such a way that they become conscious of high tide and low tide, that they learn that there is 'a time to weep, and a time to laugh, a time to mourn, and a time to dance' (Eccles. 3:4)." A Lent is still a month away, but this liturgical time between Epiphany and Ash Wednesday is celebrated around the world with grand festivities -- parties, parades, dancing, and feasting -- and ends with a cleansing of the soul through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. In America, most notably in New Orleans, we call this time Carnival, meaning "to take away the flesh (or meat)," with the final weeks referred to as Shrovetide, which stems from the word "shrive" meaning "to confess." This all culminates with Shrove Tuesday, or Mardi Gras as most of us know it where we have a grand feast and party before the somber, penitential season of Lent begins.
